FROM THE REGION COMMISSIONER

Since our last report we have had our Region AGM and I must thank Aaron Wardle and Matt Thompson for an excellently presented Annual Report. Also a special thanks to Westmead Pinnaroo Scout Fellowship who arranged the delicious afternoon tea for those present.

Planning is now almost completed for the Big Day In on 1st August and it is time to register. The A1 form is on the website, click on the poster and the form will come up. Please bring your youth members along as it is being put on for them.

We had a training session for Group Committee Office Bearers and the 30 people who attended went away knowing more than when they arrived. All districts were represented and a lot of questions were asked. Special thanks to Ann Pounder who downloaded the information and assisted in the presentation. The District Commissioners requested this training session and if it is required again next year we will look at holding it again.

Cumberland Gang Show was terrific. I do hope that many of you managed to catch a performance. Congratulations to Dr Rob Lang and all the Cast and Crew for another wonderful production. If you missed this year's show, make sure you see it next July at Parramatta Riverside Theatre.

The office staff are amazed at the number of calls they receive from Leaders checking on the registration numbers for their youth members, only to discover that many of them are not registered at all. It is a constant nightmare - youth members not registered and often they have been with the Group for many months and in some cases, over a year!

Here are just some of the issues that the office assistants deal with every day with regards to membership and registration (which really should be a simple process) and some thoughts on how to fix the problems.

- Why aren't GL's checking the census with all their Leaders at Group Council? If it is not being produced by the GL, the Leaders should insist on seeing it - at least then they could see who is registered or not! *Every Group receives a census four times a year from State Office.*
- Why don't the Leaders keep a copy of each youth member's Y1 in a folder and write the membership number on it as the child receives their card or the GL the census, or the treasurer the invoice?
- Why aren't section Leaders keeping their own records instead of relying on the GL? What if someone gets hurt - how do they know who to call, especially if the GL is the only one with a copy of the Y1? What

happens when the GL goes away?

- Why aren't parents being asked to sign a Y1 and PED on the first night? (This form then covers the prospective member during their pre-investiture time).
- Why is it taking so long (more than three months sometimes) to invest a youth member?
- Why doesn't the section Leader give the Y1 to the GL to sign, immediately following an investiture? The GL should be invited to the investiture ceremony to present the scarf and welcome the new member and parents to the Group.
- Why does the GL hold onto the forms, instead of sending them into Region Office for processing and then only produce them when a special event comes round and the youth member needs a membership number? Faxed forms are no good, original forms have to be sent in to State.
- Why doesn't the section Leader check the form when he/she receives it from the parent. They are often illegible, missing vital information and are often incomplete or covered in food and drink stains. Region Office just need page 1 and 2 not the Medical form - that is for the section Leader to keep in their folder at the hall.
- Why don't section Leaders know the membership numbers of their current youth members?
- Why is the office still receiving forms dated 2009?? Please dump all the old forms and check the latest ones on the website.
- Why do Leaders think that they do not have to fill in an A1 for activities such as Jamborette? They obtain one for all their youth members but not for themselves.
- Why don't Leaders fill in their membership number on any of their forms - don't they know it?
- Why does Region Office not receive copies of PED's for parents and carers anymore when they are given the Y1 for a new member?
- Why do Leaders wait for up to a year to receive a transfer form from the previous Group? Why don't they just submit their own? Worse part about this is that the youth member is often not registered with either Group.
- Why aren't Leaders updating their Y1's regularly. A child goes from Joeys to Cubs (CSL should have a new Y1 with updated details); child goes from Cubs to Scouts (SL needs the Y1 and the medical details updated). **Things change!** Surely it is not too hard to obtain a new Y1 every 3 years?!

As you can guess from this epistle - chasing membership numbers and paperwork takes up a huge amount of office time and not having youth members registered is a very dangerous practice. It also causes a good deal of anger in parents when they learn that their child is not a registered member even though they have been attending a Group for a long time and have been paying their fees in good faith. Why would any Leader want to put themselves at risk like that? Taking youth on activities when they are not registered members of Scouts Australia is a very dangerous business. Of course this does not apply to new chums, as long as you have a Y1 signed by the parents.

Does any of this apply to you or your Group? If so, let's fix it up now and make life easier and safer for everyone.

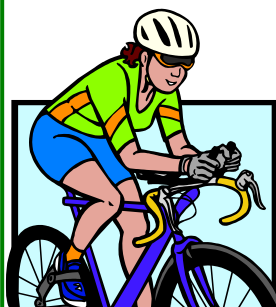
The program will give Leaders and any other interested adults, an overview on how to maintain and safely ride their bikes. They in turn will be able to run a bike safety program for their youth members.

OUR BASES AT BENTS BASIN 2010



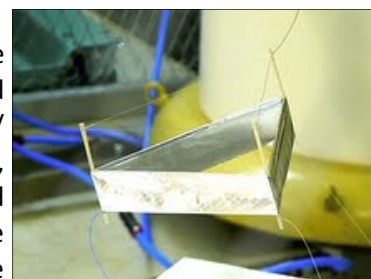
Karl used an intercom to run a **Dispatcher-Driver setup**. Two road maps were set up at different locations. The driver's map had other vehicles and road works on it, while the dispatcher's

map was clear. The dispatcher had to direct the ambulance driver to the scene of the accident street by street, redirecting the driver as obstructions were encountered. To add a degree of difficulty, Karl could introduce electrical interference and static into the comms link to simulate poor reception.

I demonstrated a High Voltage Base with a car ignition coil driving a **Jacobs Ladder**, rising spark. The Scouts had to figure out why the spark would prefer to jump across an increasing gap instead of at the initial shortest gap.



In the corner of the room, well cordoned off, I showed levitation/propulsion by ions, where a light balsa and alfoil craft lifted off the table as high voltage was applied to it. The **Ionocraft** remained hovering and bobbing side to side, restrained from floating away by nylon lines, until the voltage was turned down.



The **antigravity base** showed how washers could be slowed from falling and indeed made to 'fall' UP, by setting up vibrations in a vertical rod. A pendulum on the end of a 12 inch ruler was shown to normally prefer to hang down. When the ruler was vibrated at a critical amplitude the pendulum could be made to 'hang' UP, and would return to the vertical position when moved 30 degrees either side of vertical.



The final base investigated the domestic **Inductive Heating** method. The Scouts were first shown a resistive coil

cook top, heating water in a saucepan, and observed how the element got hot. The Inductive heater was then shown with a piece of cardboard between the 'heater' and the saucepan. As the temperature of the water rose, the pan got hot but the cook top remained cool. This really confused and amazed them as they could put their hand between the cook top and the pan and watch the water boil, without burning their hand on the cook top! The Electromagnetic waves emitted from the cook top were intercepted by a few turns of wire and shown on an oscilloscope.

I conclude the demonstration by boiling water in a plastic bucket containing a piece of steel, effectively putting the pot inside the water.

BAD NEWS FIRST. At the recent activity conference Warren Goodall, our new State Commissioner for Activities announced that there would be changes for all activities. Good news? Not yet! 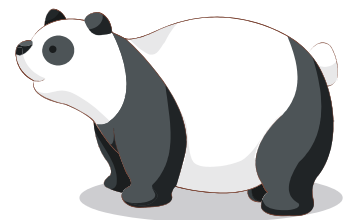
