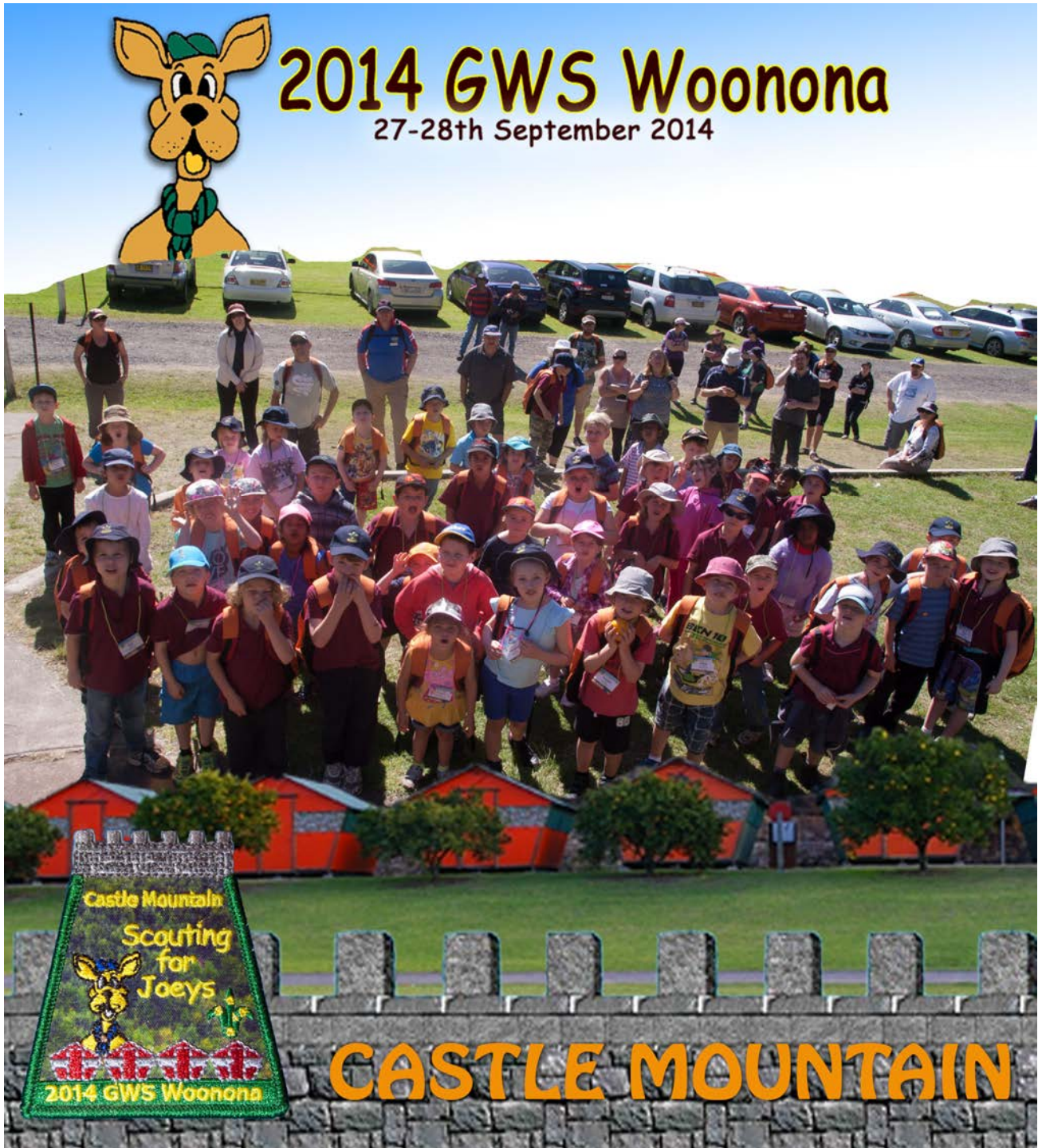

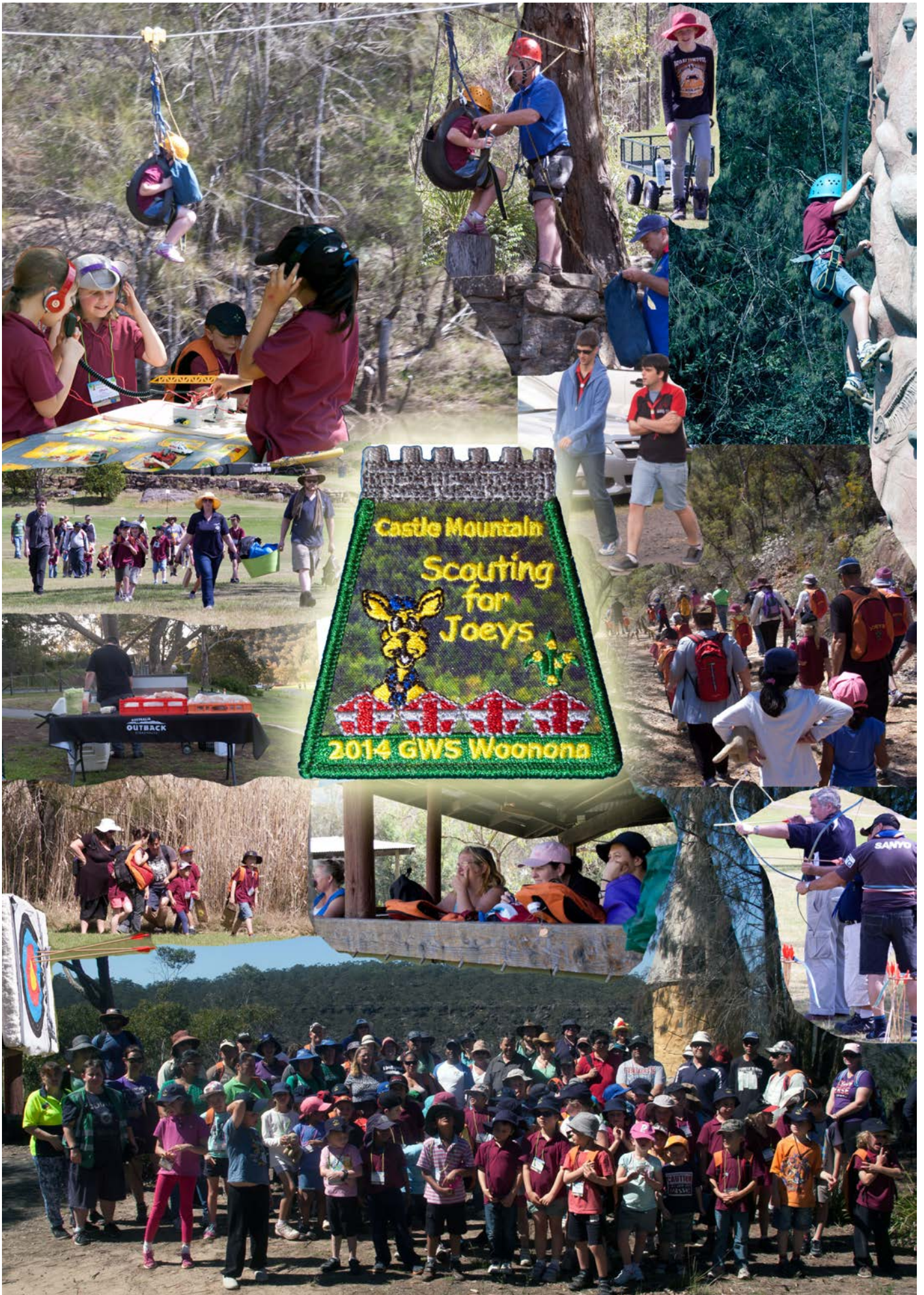

VENTURER REPORT

Congratulations to **Hamish Edwards of 1st Erskine Park Venturer Scout Unit** on being awarded the Queen's Scout Award. Hamish has challenged himself immensely to achieve this award and is a very deserving recipient.

Another successful **Unit Management course** was held last month with 25 Venturer Scouts attending. The 2015 calendar is currently available on the Region website for Units to start planning courses into their program for next year.

Rat Skin was held last month in The Golden West Region as well. Congratulations to 1st Kings Langley Venturer Scout Unit on hosting a base. Congratulations also to our GWS Region teams on achieving second and third place in the competition.

The Mawson Scholarship in Leadership conducted their most recent course in Sydney earlier this month. **Meglyn Dent from 1st/2nd Blacktown Venturer Scout Unit** was selected for the program from our Region. The participants from all over Australia enjoyed the challenging week long course, learning new skills and developing great friendships that will serve them well as they embark on new leadership roles into the future. Applications for the 2015 courses will open next month.

With lots of Units currently planning bushwalking activities, it is important to remember that candidates for the **Expedition Badge** (at VA or QSA level) should meet with their Examiner at least a month before their planned activity to complete the necessary planning tasks. It is important that the Examiner and the candidate discuss a location that is unfamiliar, and of sufficient challenge to the Venturer Scout, to satisfy the award requirements. All Examiners must hold SIS-10 Guide qualifications.

Retention of members within Scouting remains the number one issue facing our Region. The **Try Venturing** program was introduced to allow Scouts aged over 13 to be rewarded for participating in activities with their local Venturer Scout Units and as a mechanism for building enthusiasm for these young people to remain in Scouting. All adult leaders are encouraged to have their older Scouts joining with their local Units on a regular basis, including such events as the upcoming **Waratah**.

'**Region Hike 2015**' is a bushwalking activity planned for February 13-15, 2015 for all youth members in the Region aged 13 to 17 years. All adults are also invited to participate. This activity has been organised to encourage all members in the Region to get outdoors at the start of the year, to build their log of bushwalking activities, to meet new friends from across the Region and to demonstrate that bushwalking can easily be added as a regular activity in every Group's program. E1 forms will be distributed to all Scout Groups shortly and the Region looks forward to involving a record attendance at this event. Scouts will also be able to use this activity towards their Try Venturing badge and Venturer Scouts towards their Venturing Skills Badge.

We would like to invite all Venturers and Venturer Scout Leaders along to our Region Venture.

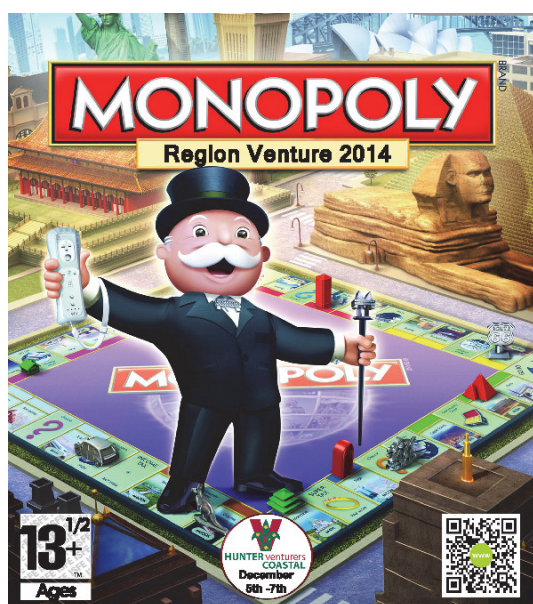

TRAINING REPORT

All applications should now be in for the last courses being held this year so now it is time to plan ahead for those who are still doing their e-learning modules. Choose a course and make sure that all e-learning is completed by the time your application goes in one month before the scheduled date.

For those leaders who wish to change sections, just go back into the e-learning site and do the extra sectional modules. You then book in for the residential course, complete the in service and then change your status by completing a transfer form. Until you complete the training for the new section you will still remain on a census with the old status.

When you are initially interviewed you are assigned a PLA. This is your PLA for life. All PLAs are experienced leaders and will be able to guide you through any extra training, even the advanced training. Keep in contact with your PLA-they might be useful.

PARRAMATTA DISTRICT HIKE

It started as a few troops pooling resources for a September hike in the Blue Mountains. It quickly turned into a District event involving 17 Scouts, 8 Venturers and 5 Leaders from 1st Carlingford, 1st Ermington, 2nd Northmead 1st North Rocks and 1st Parramatta.

Organised by The Count from 1st Parramatta, the hike started with a train trip from Parramatta to Glenbrook. We split into three groups with the Venturers up front (way, way up front as it happened), The Count (Parramatta) and Skip (Northmead) with one group of Scouts and Badger (Carlingford), Lizzie and Sparky (North Rocks) with the other. We first walked to Duck Hole and downstream along Glenbrook Creek. Along the way, the Scouts stumbled across a message from the Venturers and a lot of “cooees” followed, confirming everyone was on the right track.

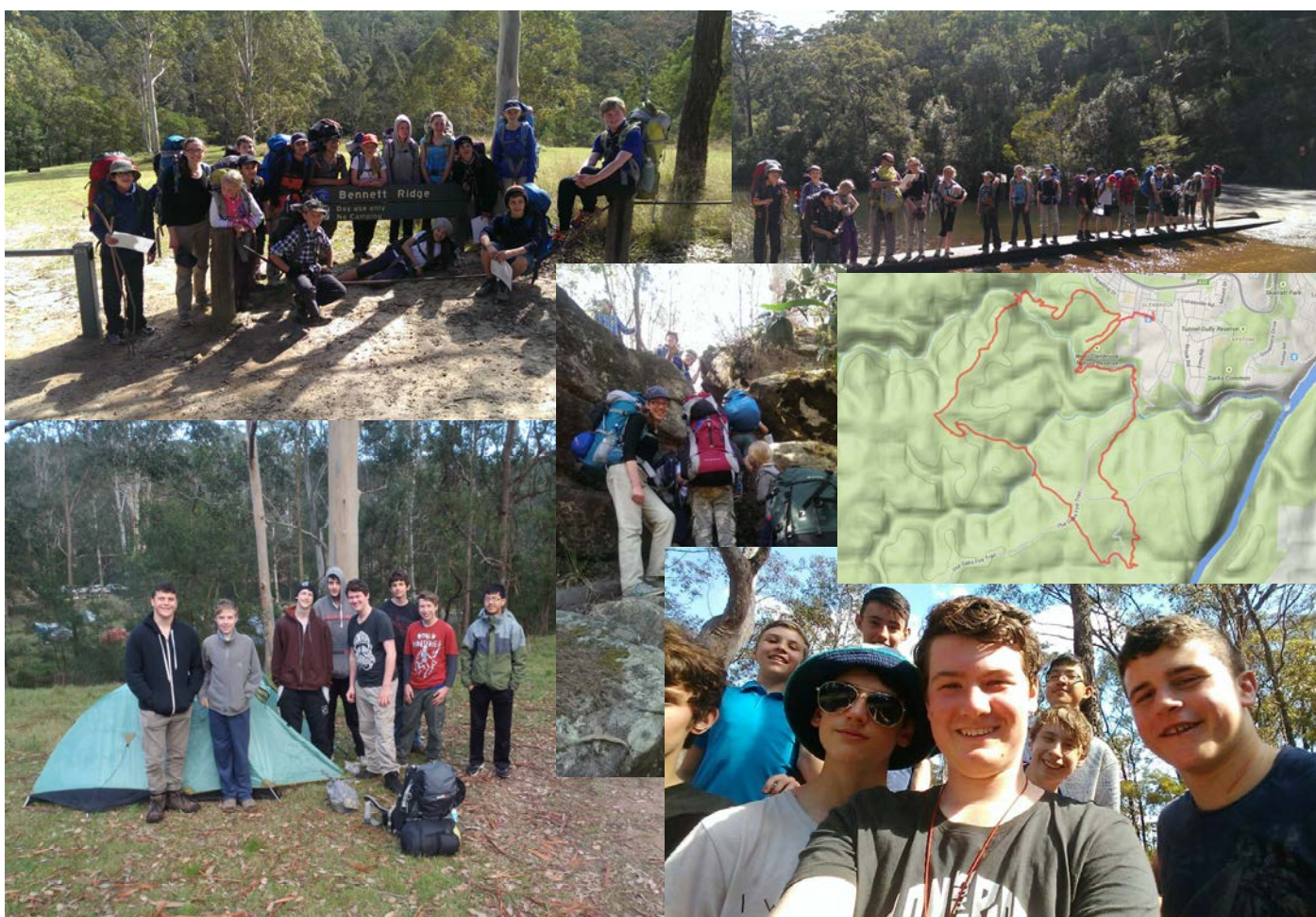
We then climbed the hill above Kanuka Brook and put in some hard bush bashing along the ridge line before finding the track to Red Hands Cave for lunch. At this point, the Venturers decided to do some sightseeing and followed Campfire Creek to the Glenbrook Causeway. The Scouts took the more direct route to Euroka Clearing to set up camp. The Venturers still beat us to camp having enough time to set up camp and start a fire before the Scouts had even arrived.

Dinner was a varied affair with an impressive array of individual and patrol-based meals. Despite the hard first day everyone was in high spirits but needed only some gentle persuasion to go to sleep for the night.

Day 2 and the Venturers were off to an early start. Having put in a good 15 km, they were intent on fish and chips, and ended up on the 10:20 train from Glenbrook after walking to the Causeway and climbing the hill back to the station. The Scouts on the other hand followed the rocks along Glenbrook Creek to Glenbrook Beach before climbing up rocks back to civilisation. This section turned out to be tougher than day 1, a point that was not lost on the Venturers judging by some of the text messages we received from them.

This hike turned out to be a great example of what Scouting is all about. Out in the bush, using bush skills to find their way around, and having fun with our Scouting friends. Will this become a regular event? Who knows, but it would be great if it did. Maybe a little less demanding next time!

CANYONING CAPERS 4 – TIGER SNAKE 2

Following the overwhelming demand for this canyon earlier in the year, this trip was scheduled to allow those who missed out to get a taste of this wonderful area. 5 Venturers and 2 Leaders from Baulkham Hills and Winston Hills Venturers joined me for an early Spring trip.

The weather was beautiful although a little cool at times, whilst the spring bloom of wattle made the walk in and out very pleasant indeed. The team moved through the canyon with great aplomb, whilst negotiating our way around a large and inexperienced group from University of Newcastle. The only incident involved Jarrod trying to prevent Cassie from dropping into the water at the bottom of one abseil which resulted in him doing a very unceremonious face plant in a small pool and getting completely soaked!

The final abseil into the slot is quite spectacular and tricky. Headlights are required because the 25m drop is into the bowels of the canyon and quite dark. Although the climb out is very steep it is relatively short and also includes a challenging clamber up a very large pagoda. The view from the top over Deanes Creek and the nearby Wollemi wilderness with its extensive network of pagodas and canyons is very rewarding.

It was a great pleasure to guide such a skilful and competent group through this canyon, which at times can be quite tricky due to the awkward abseils.
