BUSHWALKING - TRISTAN FLORES

A break in the hot weather enabled us to go ahead with our planned navigation skills from Bell to Gooches Crater on October 28 & 29. This route (approx. 16 km return) involved a fair amount of off track walking through some rugged and wild country. The rock formations and pagodas could be mistaken for a lost city on the distant horizon. It has a strong similarity to the Gardens of Stone National Park located further to the west.

We found remnants of track and rock cairns in places. Crossing the Wollangambe River also known as Snake River across a fallen tree was a highlight, so too were the bright clusters of Waratah flowers. We forgot to refill our water at the river; fortunately for us it had rained a few days earlier and we found some pools of water on the rock platforms. Our compasses experienced what we thought was magnetic interference on the main ridgeline. We are not really sure what was causing this but considered perhaps it could be iron related minerals in the rocks. We crossed paths with a group of three bushwalkers who were also in search of Gooches. We reached the rim of the crater with plenty of daylight to spare. It was a comfortable night in the cave.

Congratulations to the Scouts from 1st Carlingford, 2nd Baulkham Hills, 1st Westmead and 1st Winston Hills who completed the memorable journey. For three of these Scouts, Martin Hendricks, Oliver Cooper and Aamir Moonim it was their first overnight hike. Even for a guide it was tough, so these boys should be super proud. A special mention and thank you to Lachlan Cooper, Mitchell Stockford and Daniel Cooper for their support.

MT EVEREST

1ST WESTMEAD VENTURER UNIT

1st Westmead Venturers are embarking on the adventure of a lifetime to Mt Everest Base Camp on 25th November 2017. It will be the first time that an Australian Venturer unit has tackled this unique challenge.

It is an adventure that will take "our breath away!" The expedition and preparation activities is being led by Aaron Wardle (Scouts Australia International Commissioner).

The trek will involve walking at altitudes of up to approx 5545 metres above sea level and it will be demanding trekking, with the possibility of extreme variations in temperature. The Venturer Unit has prepared a solid training schedule in preparation of the Trek. This has included doing a least 3-4 day trek per month—involving around approximately 60km per trek. To-date training hikes have included 4 days Kosciuszko National Park; 4 days Budderwang National Park; 3 days Newnes; 3 Days Washpool National Park; and 3 Days Kanangra Walls to Katoomba and more.

Preparation has also involved sessions of walking, jogging, swimming, 5km runs, circuit training and riding to increase aerobic fitness of the participants. Members have also sought the advice of health professionals at the Children's Hospital Institute of Sports Medicine (CHISM) in Westmead and attended training session at Peak Altitude Training in the city to simulate altitudes from 3800m to 4500 metres to prepare themselves for the journey to high altitude.

Recently the Venturers organised a Fundraising screeing of 'Mountain' at Parramatta Riverside Theatres. Mountain is the dazzling documentary and exploration of our obsession with mountains. Christopher Fias-ayon Venturer Scout and cinematographer made his debut in the film industry with the launch of his two Everest Base Camp Trek Training short films at Parramatta Riverside Theatres. Congratulation Chris for making it to the big screen.
